THE ASSOCIATION OF ADFAS

The first Australian Decorative & Fine Arts Society was formed in Sydney by Mrs Patricia Robertson. Encouraged and greatly assisted by NADFAS, ADFAS Sydney held its first lecture in March 1985. It was based on the same aims and objectives as NADFAS.

The establishment of other ADFAS societies soon followed and in 1989 the ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALIAN DECORATIVE & FINE ARTS SOCIETIES INC (Association of ADFAS) was formed.

In 1994 the Association became a GROUP ASSOCIATE MEMBER OF NADFAS and still enjoys close ties with its UK counterpart, now known as The Arts Society. There are 37 societies located from Hobart to Cairns and in 2018 a Steering Committee in Perth W.A. was established.

The not for profit Association promotes the arts across rural and regional communities and is always keen to introduce new ADFAS societies wherever possible, despite the inevitable challenge of the vast distances to be covered by visiting lecturers.

The ADFAS story is one of growth and generosity of spirit. The energy and vision of its founding arts enthusiasts have ensured that the original objectives of the Arts Society and its continuing standards of excellence have been retained, whilst at the same time reflecting a uniquely Australian character.
