MONEY MATTERS *from Treasurer, Peter Farr*

I am happy to report to members that income is 15% ahead of budget for the year-to-date (primarily due to annual memberships and excellent sales of guest tickets to lectures). Expenditure is tracking considerably lower than the budget - primarily due to not having to pay our national ADFAS dues until next calendar year, as well as some savvy fiscal management. This means that once ADFAS Perth becomes an 'official' ADFAS society in a few months' time, this society will be starting on a sound financial footing.

Looking ahead, to when membership renewal notices go out at the end of 2019, hopefully those members who have encouraged guests to come along to the lectures this year will encourage them to become full members for 2020. 


TRAVEL TALES

This edition's contributor is our marketing sub-committee chair, Leanne Casellas who shares her discovery of the [Revoltella Museum](#) and its Gallery of Modern Art in Trieste, Italy.

The Revoltella was a revelation: four floors of seamlessly blended art and architecture from three palazzi (townhouses) stitched together in the early 1960s to create airy gallery spaces juxtaposed to perfectly preserved sumptuous 19th Century interiors and a rooftop that affords a 360 degree panoramic view of Trieste, the Adriatic lapping at its shores, a sloping hinterland, and Slovenia and Croatia to the south.

Nestled in the old town, its collection is vibrant and alive showcasing artists and works not widely known, predominantly from the 19th and 20th Centuries. To single out just a few; names like Leonor Fini, Clauco Cambon and Giorgio Carmelich were wonderful new discoveries for me.

The museum's beginnings stretch back nearly 150 years to when the unmarried Baron Pasquale Revoltella (1795–1869) bequeathed his home and art collection to the city of Trieste along with substantial funds to ensure a healthy ongoing acquisition programme. In less than 30 years after Revoltella's death, the collection had doubled in size making it necessary to embark upon ambitious expansion plans that

didn't completely come to fruition until 1991. Renovations included restoring Baron Revoltella's private apartments to their former opulent grandeur, and the installation of an imposing gallery entrance hall that occupies the entire height of the building. The design of this exercise in minimalism features a spiral staircase and rectangular fountain, which adhere to the original 1968 plans of architect, Carlo Scarpa.

It's these incongruities that really endear this sanctuary of the old and the new to one's heart: from light to dark, literally and metaphorically, there really is something for everyone to experience at the Revoltella and beyond into the city.



The capital of Friuli Venezia Giulia is always upstaged by its neighbouring province's capital, Venice. As cities go, Venice is a hard one to beat but if you find yourself in the northeast corner of Italy, Trieste is well worth a visit just on the strength of its 60 museums and galleries alone!

You won't be disappointed by this elegant city that boasts grand piazzas, a canal (eat your heart out Venice), stylish shops and eateries along with an extensive and venerated history as a significant port serving the Austro-Hungarian empire...and a bit of trivia is that it's also the home of Illy coffee!

ADFAS PERTH YOUNG ARTS AWARD

In response to the national ADFAS body's encouragement for local societies to promote arts activities, ADFAS Perth is exploring establishing a youth art award to support a young artist to consolidate their artistic practice.

ADFAS guidelines for these grants state applications must: *"inspire young people with a lasting enthusiasm for the arts and foster awareness of our arts heritage and its conservation and, to expand the horizons of young people through their involvement in creative arts."*

Our aspiration is to unveil the *ADFAS Perth Young Arts Award* at the 2020 lecture launch later this year.

Lester Prize for Portraiture exhibition guided tour

Previously known as the Black Swan Prize for Portraiture, the rebranded [Lester Prize](#) for Portraiture, is one of the country's richest visual arts prizes. An experienced AGWA guide will take us on an expert's tour of this year's exhibition of the 40 national finalists' work, including the winner, who will be announced on 8 November. At the end of the tour there will be an opportunity to cast your vote for the People's Choice Award.


