*Looking Back*

This year we ventured far from the traditional artistic haunts of Europe into the vast cultural and artistic legacy of Central and South America.

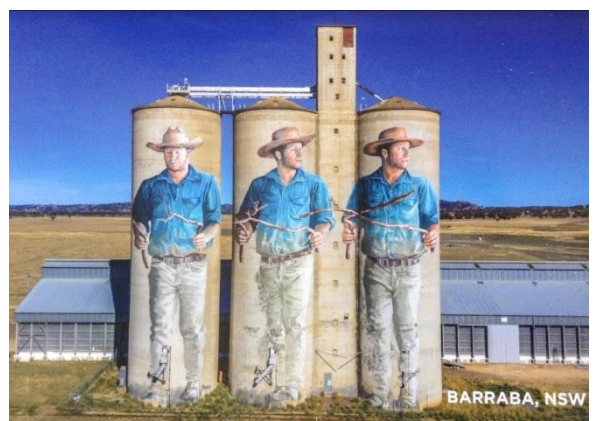
If the giant geoglyphs of the Atacama Desert in Chile (Lecture 2) and the pyramid structures of the Maya in Mexico (Lecture 4) were meant to be viewed from a distance, then perhaps the present-day Australian equivalent is an art form that **MUST** be viewed from a distance and has become synonymous with country towns - Silo Art.

In the same ilk, Finton Magee is another artist finding fame both here and overseas for large murals, street paintings and silo art. You may be familiar with his blue elephant sprouting a tree, decorating the wall at 501 Ruthven Street diagonally opposite the Art Gallery. The silos on the outskirts of Barraba in NSW were painted by Finton in early 2019 and depict a water-diviner. (Barraba has been in drought for many years.)
